2024 Mekong Tourism Forum in Lijiang a Success: See You Next Year in Luang Prabang!

It's a wrap: the Mekong Tourism Forum (MTF) 2024, held at Lijiang, China PRC, drew in hundreds of tourism professionals and both public and private travel stakeholders.

The theme, "Visionary Journeys Redefining Tomorrow's Travel", resonated with the audience - prompting constructive discussions and fruitful networking that will lead to better planning and coordination for Mekong tourism in the year to come.

The launch was graced by the presence of H.E. Zhang Zheng, China PR's Vice Minister of Culture and Tourism, whose speech revealed the sustainable and conscious-tourism future of Greater Mekong Subregion (GMS) travel.

The event also featured a keynote speech from Kimi Xiaozhou Liu, VP of Trip.com Group and CEO of TripAdvisor China, which shed light on the industry's post-pandemic transformation, along with the changing preferences of today's mindful travelers.

After the Forum's discussions, MTF delegates were able to explore Lijiang's Old Town, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Later on, they were able to experience the cable car ride to the snowy peak of Jade Dragon Snow Mountain at 4500m above sea level.

At the end of the Forum, delegates handed the Mekong Tourism Forum flag to the senior representative of Lao PDR, who will host next year's MTF in Luang Prabang.

Upcoming Festivals



10-12 May Bun Bang Fai, Thailand.

Held in May at the end of the dry season, the Bun Bangfai festival is held to bring rains down from the heavens, by firing rockets into the air. Bun Bangfai starts with all-night partying on Friday, parade day on Saturday, and Sunday, when the rockets are launched. (Tourism Authority of Thailand)



22 May Boun Visakhaboucha, Lao PDR.

Celebrated on the full moon of the sixth month in the Buddhist calendar, Boun Visakhaboucha sees devout Buddhists performing Wien Tien (Candlelight procession) in the evenings. In Vientiane, the That Luang stupa is the epicenter of Boun Visakhaboucha events. (Tourism Laos)



26 May Royal Ploughing Ceremony, Cambodia.

A symbolic ploughing procession, conducted by the King himself, marks the beginning of the rainy season in Cambodia, and traditionally predicts a range of events depending on what the royal oxen choose from a selection of seven golden trays. (<u>Tourism Cambodia</u>)

Cambodia
